Coaches' Corner



12 Characteristics of Good Scholastic Tournament

1. Player's ratings should not differ more than 400 points.
2. Family members should not play each other in events.
3. Byes should not be given if house players are present.
4. Players should play in a section that reflects their ability.
5. A tournament should have no less than 16 players.
6. House players should be known upstanding adults.
7. Tournament should start on time.
8. Player tied for an award should always receive a prize.
9. Money prizes should be avoided for scholastics.
10. Two directors should be present during all events.
11. Tournament directors should be of legal age.
12. Tournament areas should be alcohol and smoke free.
